## **12A Introduction**

Anansi (“The Spider”) is one of the most important figures in West African folklore. There are many Anansi tales, all of which were passed from person to person through story-telling. For hundreds and hundreds of years, they weren’t written down. Anansi is a special character. In his stories, he sometimes takes the form of a spider and other times takes the form of a human. This is an Anansi story about the moon.

## 12C Words Defined

### gorge

**(noun)** A narrow passage between steep cliffs, usually with a stream running through. *Riding in a canoe, Emma passed through a towering **gorge**.*

**(verb)** To stuff oneself with food; to eat too much. *Giovanni **gorged** himself at the all-you-can-eat buffet.*

### illuminate

**(verb)** 1. To light up; to supply with light. *The room was **illuminated** by a single light bulb that the magician held in her hands.* 2. To make known or clear. *I read Tony's diary, and some of the passages really **illuminated** why he and Mica don't get along.*



### intercept

**(verb)** To stop or seize something while it's on its way somewhere. *Marco threw a paper airplane; I jumped up to **intercept** it before it hit Ms. Pew in the back.*

Other forms: *Thanks to the **interception** (noun) of the letter, the English were able to crack the German code during World War II.*

### jubilation

**(noun)** A feeling of great joy. *The **jubilation** that Ashley felt when she hit the game-winning shot was hard to describe.*

### occasion

**(noun)** A particular time or happening. *On this kind of serious **occasion**, we take time to remember those who came before us.*

Note: When occasion is preceded by the word on, the meaning is "from time to time." *She likes to take bike rides on **occasion**.*

### preserve

**(verb)** To save; to protect. *I know I'll be different when I get older, but I want to **preserve** least a little bit of my hilarious sense of humor.*

### sever

**(verb)** To separate a part from the whole by cutting. *The chain had been **severed**, probably by a very powerful tool.*

### soar

**(verb)** To fly high in the sky. ***Soaring** above the city, Superman looked down at the little people below and felt lonely.*

### talon

**(noun)** A claw (especially of a bird of prey). *On the \$1 bill, you can see an image of an eagle gripping bundles of arrows and olive branches in its **talons**.*

### tropical

**(noun)** Of or similar to the tropics, the area near the Equator. *There's nothing like a **tropical** vacation to make you hate the winter.*

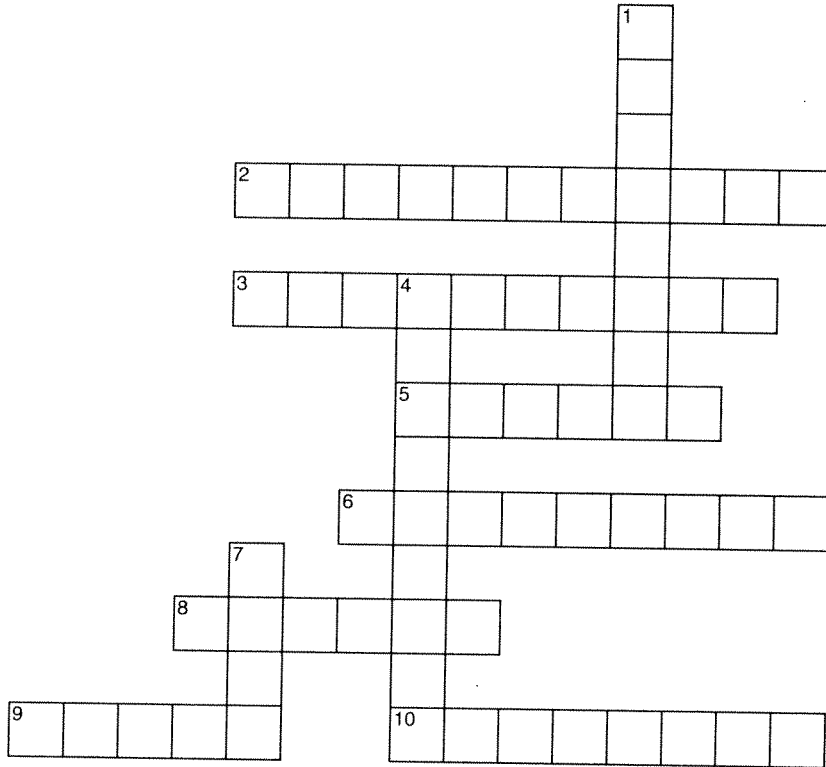
